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Activity 2.1.3

Following the implementation of Component II, this activity took place from 15 to 19 of December.

Two short term experts from Spain and two other from Hungary conducted four regional round tables where representatives from institutions involved in civil enforcement had the chance to discuss solutions for improving cooperation among them. Round tables took place in Zagreb, Rijeka, Osijek and Split.

The outputs produced under activities 2.1.1 and 2.1.2 were the base for debates and the participants also provided new ideas and suggestions, that will be taken into account at the time of drawing up final recommendations for improvement of coordination and communication mechanisms between stakeholders within the enforcement system (activity 2.1.4)

Activity 1.1.5

This activity was implemented from 23 to 27 February. Two STEs organized a workshop in order to prepare the recommendations for improvement of the enforcement monitoring system, which will define monitoring indicators, evaluation criteria and models of reports regarding monitoring activities. The following Institutions participated in the workshop: Ministry of Justice, Chamber of public notaries, FINA, Ministry of Finance and County courts.

The main topics considered were inputs and conclusions drawn from the comparative overview of the enforcement systems, prepared under activity 1.1.3, and from the conclusions made during the round tables, organized under activity 1.1.4.

Activity 2.2.2

It also took place from 2 to 13 February. Two technical experts conducted an in-deep analysis of the Croatian IT systems, with special emphasis to IT systems supporting enforcement and legal communication with stakeholders. Based on this analysis and the result of activity 2.2.1 a final report with recommendations for improvement of the enforcement system from the IT aspect was produced. The recommendation should include a proposal for two models for improvement of the system. Both models will aim at expedite the process of enforcement, guarantee transparency, access to information by interested parties with respect to citizens' rights on data protection and European standards.




Activity 1.1.4
